









## How would you rate this instructor overall as a teacher?





### What are the strengths of this course?

#### Comment

Very well organized, very clear that the instructor is passionate, cares a lot about the students, and most importantly UNDERSTANDS the students and their needs

Its panel discussions and usefulness of assignments. The class discussion was also great. I really loved that you could choose your own assignments based on what you needed to work on.

Paul matched the coursework well with a) what students needed at the time (job searching, interview prep, presentation work, reflection) and b) with the fact that it is a one credit class (I could see some professors struggling to scale back in light of this).

Great practical preparation for the job search process - the resume, the cover letter, and to a lesser extent the first interview. The instructor made this a course strength by being skilled in this area and available outside of class and via email to work on these things.

Paul Brown is awesome! Very sharp and engaging.

Give dedicated time to resume and cover letter tweaking

Strengths include flexibility of the instructor, the ability to "choose your own adventure" and select the assignments that you feel passionate about, and the ability to reflect on one's working experience. Paul Brown is actually a major strength himself!

## How could the instructor improve the course?

#### Comment

There was a lot of writing for a one credit course, although the reflections were helpful and had excellent/helpful comments from the instructor. Overall, though, probably too much coursework for one credit.

I can't think of anything!

It was honestly nearly perfect, Paul adapted the course to our interests along the way. He is a great professor.

The practical preparation needs to go beyond the first interview. Positions seem to have 2, 3, 4, or even more interviews with everyone and his brother. Preparation should include how to be consistent but also fresh in successive interviews and how to prepare to interview with a potential supervisor, peer, supervisee, and department director of executive.

Reflection is great, but was excessive for a one credit course.
