





So many of the assignments were due right after TPE, which is frustrating. This is hard because the class prepares you for TPW, yet I had 4 assignments due upon returning from the conference, which to me, was counterintuitive. As I ams sure is a complaint every year there do seem to be a great deal of little assignments for a class that is just one credit.

The instructor could improve the course by perhaps removing at least one journal entry. I did enjoy reflecting, but I felt as though my reflections would have been stronger if I did not have to do so many.

there was such a big gap in when the class met which was difficult, and the final reflection seemed silly with a journal

due just before that.

- By offering alternatives to missing class (such as attending another session), of which we did not have many during the semester, students would feel less pressured if they did have to miss a class.

More feedback on resumes and cover letters. Help with job search. Suggestions on getting involved with associations.

Continue to focus on the practical application to the profession!

I wish that this course, with a focus on career preparation, was the 2-credit portion of the field experience program. I felt like the first half of the course was sort of a waste of time - that course could have met 5 times, while the job search/preparation seminar could have met every other week.

I don't really understand the point of a class that meets 5 times. Why does BC require field experience when so many other master's programs don't? The instructors of field experience approach the class as if nobody in the room has ever held a full time job before and since that's not true, I wish that were not the case. In complete honesty, requiring each student to have a certain number of meetings

Some of the course readings didn't seem graduate level to me, so I would glance over them.

Possibly reduce the number of journal entries and/or assignments- it was kind of a lot of work for a one credit class.

Meet with students one on one instead of having 4 journal entries

I just think this course in its entirety is a bit much, especially for students who have had jobs before. I think less journals would help--I felt that I ran out of things to say with the amount of journaling. I did enjoy class discussions about "the perfect job" and the informational interview assignments, but there were other times when the amount of work felt like a lot for this class.
